

From the Vicar, the Revd Rosy Barrie

All good gifts around us are sent from heav'n above then thank the Lord O thank the Lord for all his love

We're celebrating our Harvest Festival on October 1st although we will keep our harvest decorations up for a number of weeks, so do pop in and have a look at what members of our church, community and St Martin's School have created! This year we are thinking about the many different harvests that we enjoy in addition to our daily food. For example trees provide wood, paper, and rubber as well as edible fruit, nuts and syrup. We mine minerals (like iron ore for metal) and mud (like clay for pottery and bricks), we use sand for glass making. The sea not only provides us with sea food and fish but with salt and sea weed, long used by our coastal and island communities as a food, scientists are now experimenting to see how seaweed can be turned into packaging instead of using plastic. Sheep provide us with wool, for clothing, bedding, house insulation. A sunflower can lift our spirits with its bright yellow splash, we can also eat sunflower seeds or crush them into oil. As we look around us at the human world, at the many problems and tragedies that must be dealt with somehow or other, it is beneficial to our mental and spiritual health that we also look at such blessings and wonders in creation, that we seek balance between both realities. We look and remember God makes grass to grow, green plants for our health, lifts up the poor, heals the brokenhearted, calls the stars by name, gives the beasts their food and the young ravens when they cry (Psalm 147). Let us then be thankful, and put our trust in God's steadfast love.


