

From the Vicar, the Revd Rosy Barrie

Did Herod have secret policemen as his ears and eyes and spies? Perhaps we need to rewind, and remind ourselves who Herod was the ruler of Judea at the time of the birth of Jesus. Known as Herod the Great, he appears in Matthew's stories of the birth and infancy of Jesus and has a reputation for being cruel and ruthless. It is to Herod's court in Jerusalem that the Magi (wise men or kings) go, looking for the new born king of the Jews. They have followed a unique star that arose in the east, and now seek further guidance, which they accept from Jewish scriptures: they will find the child in Bethlehem as the prophet foretold. Assisted now by star and text, the Magi continue until they find the child, an overwhelmingly joyful experience. They remain as symbols of hope for all who struggle to God by strange routes, who wander the world until they find him. But back in his palace, Herod is agitated and angry, at this possible upstart who potentially could topple him or his heirs from the throne. With deceitful tongue, Herod had asked the Magi to return with the child's location. Their failure to do so leads to the massacre of the innocents, all infant baby boys in and around Bethlehem. Did Herod have secret police to commit such atrocities? The charity Open Doors (serving persecuted Christians worldwide) has produced a humourous and colourful Christmas book and video imagining there were secret police (opendoorsuk.org/herod). Secret Policeman Number 3 is sent to follow the Magi. Disquised as a shepherd, he disappears into the night. There's a twist in the end, as the policeman discovers finding this baby is a life changing event. Rather than betraying them to Herod, he offers to take Mary, Joseph and the baby to where they can cross the border into safety in Egypt without being seen. "How do you know the way?" asks Joseph. "I...used to be a secret policeman." "And what are you now?" "I don't know. Somebody different. Somebody better." This Christmas, encouraged by the example of the Magi, I hope that all of us will make coming to church our priority, that we might kneel and pay him homage and be filled with joy. I hope that we will come to church excited to be able to freely celebrate the birthday of Jesus, and leave as somebody different, somebody better. And I hope that we will remember to pray for our persecuted Christian brothers and sisters who must disappear into the night, but above whom, as for us, the bright star still shines.

Lastest from Iran

Today, I discussed a critical and complex issue—the mass protests in Iran in November 2019, a chapter that significantly impacted the nation's history.




