#### From the Vicar, the Revd Rosy Barrie

Some days I hear the world news and don't quite know what to do with the information: it's all so upsetting. Sadly this is nothing new: each generation throughout history has had to deal with heart stopping bad news, the consequences of choices made, the fall out of human cruelty. We see this long ago in the Bible. Take the prophet Ezekiel as an example. After the capture of Jerusalem by the Babylonians in 586 BC he was one of the Jewish exiles forced from their homeland. Despite all the news being bad, and life bitterly hard, he was a man of deep faith and imagination, who heard the voice of the LORD and saw visions, including one of a valley of dry bones (Ezekiel 37). Ezekiel sees very many very dry human bones scattered over the landscape, symbolic of how God's people feel: dried up, with no hope and no future. But then the LORD tells him to speak, and with a great rattling the bones begin to reconnect and to be re-fleshed. Finally God's breath fills these bodies, and they come to life and stand up. Ezekiel is given the message that however dreadful, desperate and dry life is, there is always the promise of new life, energy and a different future, because God is always present, and where God is, there life can burst out and flourish again, especially when people soften stubborn hearts and choose to be obedient to God

There is an echo of this in the message of Easter Day, when God raises his Son from the dead. How much greater is the resurrection of Jesus, even than a vision of rising bones, for it happens as a reality in our human world. Those who saw in despair Jesus cruelly crucified encounter him gloriously alive again, he breathes into their broken bodies, and a new unexpected life for the community of his friends begins.

As we travel through the dusty desert rocky road of Lent and into the spring time of Easter, may we discover this for

ourselves: God's new energy, new breath, and a new future, for us and for others.






